(Children are familiar with both these methods of work from class)	<u>SESE</u> Discuss your family and learn about your aunties, uncles, cousins and grandparents. Understand how all these people are related. Complete pages 80 and 81 of Small World. Maybe get a few sheets of paper or card and stick them together- you might like to make your own family tree.	<u>SESE</u> Think of objects that can be pushed or pulled. Get some toy cars and push/pull them along flat surfaces that are both rough and smooth. Now do the same thing from a height, make some form of a ramp and see how the toy cars move when the height of the ramp is changed. Record your findings in pictures or words. Complete worksheet attached.	<u>Art</u> Do something artistic- there are lots of ideas on Art Hub or Twinkle.	<u>PE</u> I challenge you to set up an obstacle course with any equipment that you have at home. Get your brothers/sisters to help you and then complete the obstacle course, maybe you could time yourselves and beat your time. Go Noodle is also good for exercise ideas.
