SESE- Science

- Go to **see saw** for demonstration from teacher
- Get some toy cars at home and try to move them along the ground- do they need to be pushed /pulled or both. Could you stick the wheels of one car so that the wheels don't move. Do the wheels roll or slide when moving them along the ground.
- Predict what would happen if you put them on a ramp- would they roll or slide
- (roll means that the wheels/ object roll around, slide means that they don't move)
- Make a ramp and see can you push the cars down the ramp.
- Test other objects on the ramp to see do they roll or slide eg. paper clip, marble. Rubber, ball etc
- If you make the ramp higher or lower does that make a difference?
- You could also play with these objects on rough or smooth surfaces to see does the surface make a difference.
- You could measure how far the cars travelled if you wanted.
- In your copy- write down three things that you have learnt from playing with the cars, other objects and ramps.
