On Seesaw this week I will put up 3 assignments and I will also put up 2 short maths tutorial videos on Tuesday and Thursday morning in relation to lines and angles. As stated last week if schoolwork is a struggle I would ask you to prioritise your child's reading and to encourage them to engage with their AR accounts if access to a device is possible. Reading:

I think each student should be well able to read for half an hour each weekday. A good number of students accessed their accounts the past five weeks but for anyone who didn't and there's a device available please encourage them to access their AR accounts using the link below.

Gaeilge:

To access Sin é!3 online you need to go to www.edcolearning.ie. Once in the site you then have to enter a username and a password. You can find these on the homepage but in case you can't see them the username is primaryedcobooks and the password is edco2020. Once you find Sin é!3 in the menu our theme this month is An Teilifís (you may have to rightclick and press openlink to access this). We continue with our theme (Caitheamh Aimsire (Pastimes)) and the following is the work I would like the children to do this week-

-Monday: Pg 153. An féidir leat? (Can you?): Tarraing (draw) the two pictures at the bottom of the page
1. I can swim 2. I can play basketball

-Tuesday: pg 154 Caitheamh Aimsire Pháid agus a Chairde (Paddy and his friend's pastimes): Read through story and put in all the words that are missing.

-Wednesday: Pg 155- Gadaí agus Garda (thief and the garda) listen to the song (Track 35 on children's own cd.)

-Thursday: Pg 155: Gadaí agus Garda (thief and the garda) listen and sing the song.

Maths: We will continue to work from our Mathemagic 3 this week looking at lines and angles. The kids have some nice easy problem solving activities on Monday to ease them into the week! As stated previously CJ Fallon have made it free to access all their books and the following is the link to access it:

After some challenging work on division last week hopefully the children will find lines and angles an easier topic this week. Hopefully the videos on Seesaw will be of some help to people. The 'Solve the puzzles' activities on pg126 are a good way to get children thinking so hopefully they will enjoy those.

English: We looked at similes earlier in the year and I would like the children to try and write out 6 similes of their own (not the ones in the book!) If possible read 'The Tortoise and the Hare' or another of Aesop's Fables and find out what the 'moral of the story is'. Write your own story and what the moral of that story is.

SESE: The children's topic in Science/Geography this week is again 'Materials'. I thought the children could try the experiments on pgs 108&109 in their books. They're both quite easy to set up and use common household items; selection of different balls and hangers. In history we continued to look at the story of Tom Crean this week. I thought the children could pretend they accompanied Tom Crean on the Terra Nova and write a letter home to their family. PE: In my previous posts I suggested a number of links including Joe Wicks, GoNoodle and Donna Dunne Fitness to keep active. T.J Reid is still running his two free Facebook Live classes a week for children that mix GAA skills and fitness. Another thing I thought the children could do is practise for a sports week. Twinkl are running a sports week from home on the first week of June and I was hoping to get the children to engage in it. For this week's challenge for our GAA players I'd like again to tie it in to 'Our Future Club Stars' competition which the county board started running this week. It's for u-13 players so I've made the challenge slightly easier for our class:

-This challenge involves a wall again so please choose wisely; no broken glass!!As if you were taking a free roll lift and strike the ball off the wall. Control it without catching it and strike it back off the wall again. Repeat this and see how many strikes you can get in before you lose control of the ball. The aim of this is to improve your first touch and balance but remember you can't catch the ball; you have to control and then strike it off the hurl. You measure your success by the amount of consecutive strikes you can get without the ball being dropped
