We've been doing lots of work on our Irish Grammar and Oral Irish, culminating in a very successful Seachtain na Gaeilge where we made great efforts to speak 'cúpla focail' on yard. We have also been enjoying Irish dancing lessons with Evelyn White and had a chance to show off our newly acquired dancing skills during the Céilí on March 16th.
