It was so interesting to learn all about neurodiversity this week. We watched videos and shared stories on how brains can work differently and celebrated how these differences are a beautiful thing.

Rang 5 have been working hard on our confirmation preparation. Creating symbolic flames for the Holy Spirit, learning about the gifts of the Holy Spirit and reflecting on how we experience the Holy Spirit.

In art we've created and displayed our lovely pieces. We explored mosaics, volcanoes inspired by Hokusai, and an acrylic painting of a leprechaun.

Procedural Writing has been going really well. We really enjoy putting steps together to explain how to do something.

SESE has been jam packed this term. We have been taking a deep dive into Irish history and looking at the 15th and 16th century. This has given us a better understanding of Irish culture and the hardships Irish went through during that time. Electricity has been so interesting this term. We made basic circuits with lightbulbs and buzzers. A Marine Biologist visited us this month to tell us all about the changes happening in the ocean. We are currently carrying out an experiment to see how the rise in acidic levels in the ocean is affecting the flora and fauna in the sea. We will be plotting a graph to see how our shells are doing in a petri dish of vinegar.

We are delighted to be starting rugby this month. We got some funny nicknames and played great games. Learning a new sport is fun.

Maths has been challenging us with percentages, mixed numbers, improper fractions and time. We did really well on our maths assessment and have been revising anything we find difficult.
